As of right now, the sell-by date for the property remains on or before the end of February. We will offer updates as they come up.

## Lent: February 14th to March 27th (excluding Sundays)

In the season of Lent, we enter into the forty-day fast that Jesus undertook in the wilderness. We prepare our hearts and minds for the celebration of Easter in this season through the traditional practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving--all things that are meant to deepen our connection to God.

The season starts with the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. It is in this service that we are reminded that we are dust, and to dust we shall return.

You may be wondering: why doesn't Lent include Sundays? Even during Lent, we are called to treat every Sunday like a little Easter! On Sundays, we celebrate the paschal mystery: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Sundays are always meant to be days of celebration and feasting.



### **Lenten Study Small Groups**

New Life is doing a joint Lenten Study with Florence United Methodist Church as part of our ongoing Friendship Process. The theme for the study is "Wandering Heart: Figuring Out Faith with Peter". There will be singing, reflection, Scripture study, and more!

# NLLC Church Council Meeting Minutes January 18, 2023

Call to Order: President, Wayne Kern called the Council meeting to order at 4:00 pm. Present were Roy Hager, Sue MacTaggart, Cathy Dietz, Bryant Payne, Treasurer, Lisa Dreher, Secretary, and Pastor Paul Strike.

Meeting opened with Pastor Paul leading prayer.

**Minutes:** Approval of Council Minutes for two separate meetings held on December 21, 2023. Lisa made the motion to approve both minutes, Roy seconded, the motion was passed.

**Treasurer's Report:** Bryant presented December financials. Reviewed adjustments in previous year(s) payroll deductions. Explained new Quick Books system installation issues. Pastor Paul made Portico corrections to his contract. The revised contract was signed and dated by Wayne and Lisa.

President's Report: Wayne thanked returning council members and newly elected members. Wayne also provided special thanks to Bryant for the many roles he has accepted in the areas of finance for the church. A recent conversation with Andy Johnson indicated that there are no hold-ups with the buyer regarding the closing of the property sale. Andy asked for a copy of the approved partition request. Rob Ward, surveyor, will be setting flags to finalize the platting. We can't order the title until the survey is complete. An extension request for closing may be necessary; the Buyer would set a date. The survey will resolve the issue with the neighbor regarding the fence line.

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Paul has been offered a part-time position at Camp Lutherwood beginning January 29, 2024. This will not interfere with his full-time position at church, and any scheduling issues will be discussed as they arise. Pastor Paul was congratulated on this great opportunity for outreach. No official approval is needed from the council. Friendship process with the Methodist church is proceeding. A successful potluck and game night was held at the Methodist church on January 17<sup>th</sup>. Further events include a combined study for Lent, more details to come. Shared Free Lunch service on February 29<sup>th</sup> at the Methodist church has been planned, volunteers have been arranged. Ash Wednesday/Valentine's Day service will be held at the Methodist church, February 14<sup>th</sup> at 4:30 pm.

Old Business: Camp Florence has finished working, and Wayne proposed additional work east to the new property line. Wayne has also proposed additional trimming to the south property line between Spruce Street and the east edge of the south parking lot. There was discussion on what can be done to shield the exposed refuse in the neighbor's yard, temporary vs. permanent solutions. Carpeting in the library. Sue and Cathy confirmed that a quote was received from Goodman's. It was decided to postpone this re-carpeting until a committee can be set up to prioritize implementation of building improvements. Sue will contact Goodman's to inform them of this decision. Dan and Wayne are continuing to look for materials to construct a chain link fence between the garage and the church. This has been budgeted and will be materials only, they will provide the labor. The Uptown AA contract will be modified to reflect our standard fee schedule for meetings. The change will be from \$13.24 per meeting for 4 meetings a week to \$15.00 per meeting for 3 meetings a week. Bryant made the motion, Sue seconded, and the motion was passed.

**New Business:** Wayne proposed we start planning for the influx of cash from the sale of the property. We will need a short-term plan for most of the funds as well as a long-term plan. For now, a short-term plan will be investigated by a 5–7-member committee with members from the council including Wayne, Roy, Bryant and Pastor Paul and will have congregation volunteers. An announcement was made at the January 21<sup>st</sup> service by Wayne asking for interested parties to contact any member of the council for information, and it will be in the monthly newsletter as well. Roy made a motion to create a short-term financial planning committee to determine appropriate investment options for the cash from the sale of the property. Bryant seconded and the motion passed. It was decided to discuss options to create a barrier along the south property line, Spruce to parking lot edge, at the Leadership retreat. Leadership retreat will be at the parsonage, February 24<sup>th</sup>, from 9:30 and to 12:30 pm. Wayne and Pastor Paul to plan the agenda to review the last year and plan for this year.

Next Meeting: February 15, 2024, at 4:00 pm.

**Meeting Closed:** Pastor Paul closed with the Lord's Prayer. Adjourned at 5:10 pm.
