




Dear Folks and Friends of New Life,

In the grave they laid him, love by hatred slain,

Church Council Meeting Minutes March 21, 2023

Call to Order: President, Wayne Kern called the Council meeting to order at 4:00 pm. Present were

Roy Hager, Sue MacTaggart, Bryant Payne, Treasurer, Barb Vogel, Vice-President, Lisa Dreher,

Meeting opened with Pastor Paul leading prayer.

Minutes: Approval of Council Minutes for the meeting held on February 15th, Roy made the motion to approve both minutes, Sue seconded, the motion was passed.

Treasurer's Report:

Bryant presented February financials. **1**. Council agreed to make insurance payments and Synod on a quarterly basis.

President's Report:

Wayne presented the following items. **1**. Sale of land update: Rob Ward completed the survey of the property. **2.** The Financial Planning Committee met, next meeting April 19 th . **3.** The Men's Group attended to small landscape projects.

Pastor's Report:

- **1.** Holy Week plans in place. **2.** April 5 th -7 th, Pastor will be away, Barb to inquire into availability of a substitute.
- **3.** New member class may be in April or possibly in the fall.

Old Business:

needed. **2. Neighbor reports:** a. Food Share, concern over a burnt-out streetlight at north side of the parking lot on Spruce continues. Pastor to contact the city to report outage. **b**. Bright Beginnings Preschool has been experiencing increases in cost of business burdens and requested forgiveness of rent for July and August of the toddler room due to summer recess and a guarantee of no increase in their rent for the facility next year. Roy motioned we for-

due to summer recess and a guarantee of no increase in their rent for the facility next year. Roy motioned we forgive the requested \$800.00 rent of the toddler space and table the discussion of the rent freeze until a later date. Bryant seconded; motion passed. Pastor Paul will notify the preschool of our decision. **3.** Refresh committee will be needed to prioritize repairs and maintenance of the church. Their recommendations will either be given to the Men's Group to implement or contracted out. Roy to preside and Sue will be on the committee. We will be seeking additional members to assist. **4.** Weapon/gun policy in process. Proposals will be emailed to council members, and we will vote on a final draft.

New Business:

1. Pastoral leave coverage progressing. Deacons will cover pastoral care; Lay ministers will be asked to fill in, and Pastor Greg of the Presbyterian church will be available for emergencies. We will join the Presbyterian church for one Sunday service on May 19 th. We will budget coverage of pulpit supply to cover some of the six Sundays needed for Pastor Paul's parental leave and vacation. 2. Synod Assembly is June 1 st. We will need 2 representatives to attend and vote in the yearly business meeting. They must be registered by May 1 st and the Pastor to recruit. 3. Bridges Program of Florence. A request to offer an invitation to their unhoused occupants to attend our church was made. These folks have been vetted to be able to stay at this 24/7 pallet housing shelter and the Anchor of Hope van would be used for their transportation. Possible additional training for mental health and first aid may be made available to our congregation and this will be looked into as well as further information into their program guidelines.
