NLLC Church Council Meeting Minutes

February 20, 2025

Call to Order: President Wayne Kern called the Council meeting to order at 4pm. Present were Pastor Jennifer Yocum, Roy Hagar, Dave Braley, Bryant Payne, Carrie Aburto, Don Stewart, and Secretary Lisa Dreher. Meeting opened with a prayer.

Minutes: Dave made a motion to approve the minutes of January 16th, Roy seconded, and the motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Bryant presented the January financials. \$5K is requested for catering and supplies for the 75th anniversary celebration. We will need to have a congregational meeting to approve funds, Dave made the motion to have a special meeting on March 16th after service to put this request to a vote. Roy seconded and the motion passed.

President's Report:

Water heater replacement. The water heater has been showing signs of needing replacement, it will be monitored. **HVAC evaluation**. May need to do an energy audit for our heating system in the near future. **Organist/Pianist update.** No candidates have applied for this position. More efforts will be made to advertise for the opening.

Pastor's Report:

Altar Guild. Pastor Jennifer met with the Altar Guild to plan for Holy Week celebrations. The Methodist church will host Ash Wednesday, March 5th, at 4 pm, then Presbyterian church is having a soup supper at 5:30 pm and a Lenten devotional at 6:15 pm. Maundy Thursday, April 17th, will be hosted by the Presbyterian church, and we will host Good Friday celebrations at 4 pm, April 18th. Palm fronds and lilies have been ordered. The altar guild approved purchase of a Lenten chasuble and a lectern cloth, a private donation paid for these items. Membership rolls. A letter has been sent to 9 members asking if they wish to remain on our rolls. Currently we have 49 active members, 35 that contribute, and approximately 25 that attend. 25 members are needed for a quorum, according to our current constitution. Safe Space zoom meeting. Wayne and Pastor Jennifer attended this meeting for information on what to do if ICE comes to our church. Know your rights cards will be printed for distribution. Our response to judicial vs. an ICE warrant was explained. Partnerships. The Methodists are content with their new pastor. Presbyterians are busy with internal programs. Episcopalians are not interested in shared worship. Website and media. Bryant will update information on our website. Paul Strike's name will be removed from our sign. Delegates. Roy and Ann are interested in attending the Synod meeting.

Old Business:

Alarm incidents. Roy recommends the key pad be replaced to alleviate the alarm code errors. **Fence update.** 1st estimate is high, we will get a 2nd estimate and discuss.

New Business:

Office coverage. Cathy requested time off in March and August. **Transition Team.** Work continues, next meeting is February 26th. Congregational input is to be planned. A second laptop for zoom meetings is needed, Roy made the motion to make a purchase up to \$700.00, Carrie seconded, the motion passed. **Applicability of Gun Policy.** Food Share asked if our gun policy applies to them as leased property. Discussion indicated that our policy does not apply to them. An earlier vote was taken, 4 yes, 3 no. Dave moved to reconsider the vote, Don seconded. A new vote was taken and passed that Food share be informed that it needs to make its own policy, and that the Council recommends a non-lethal approach.

Next meeting. March 20, 2025 at 4 pm.

Meeting Adjournment. Meeting adjourned with a prayer from Pastor Jennifer.
